

# Internship Syllabus

## **Summary**

The Creation Experience Internship program is a hands-on, guided course designed to provide youth aged 14-17 with a strong foundation in the Word of God. They will receive training in creation apologetics and a worldview perspective for defending the Gospel. ***Internship***

The internship is a flexible creation ministry internship for students aged 14-17. It includes opportunities in creation science studies, apologetic presentation, and ministry service. Students will be asked to visit the museum once a week for a full day of activities, during which their work will be graded, and they will receive their next assignment. A trainer will work directly with them on their class day. (Please check with a training staff member to see which day of the week has been designated for their museum day.) Each student will receive a Certificate of Completion upon completion of the course.

**After graduation, students are invited to continue serving at the museum if they choose.**

## **Schedule**

The Creation Experience Internship is designed to be completed in 12 weeks. Students will work through individual modules that cover subjects such as Creation, Biology, Geology, Paleontology, Archaeology, Astronomy, and the Gospel.

## **Experience**

- Guided Self-Study
- Information presentation
- General Operations ( Hospitality, Bookstore, etc.)
- Science Stations (Fossil Dig/Paleontology, Animals, Microscopes)
- Mentoring
- Acquire skills to communicate what they have learned.

## **Additional Information**

The internship is a non-accredited certificate program. Although we strive for a high standard of biblical and apologetics training, certain academic institutions may choose to apply our program(s) as academic credit; they are under no obligation to do so at this time.

Due to the interactive nature of the internships, the program is limited to 7 active interns at a time. If all slots are filled, the applicant will be added to the list for the next scheduled course.
